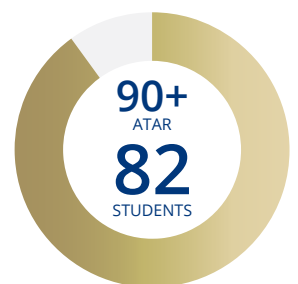
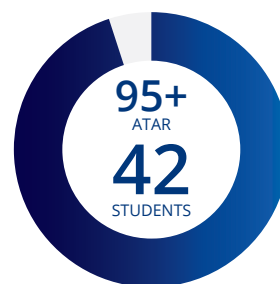
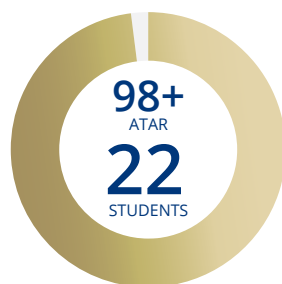
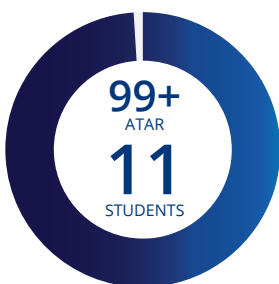


Higher School Certificate and International Baccalaureate Results 2025

We are delighted to share with you the outstanding results of the Class of 2025 in their Higher School Certificate and International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme examinations, one of the best sets of academic results achieved in the past 20 years.

We are exceptionally proud of the fact that **52% of the Class of 2025 achieved an ATAR of 90 or more**, with a **median ATAR of 90.6**. This is a true reflection of how this Year Group has worked collaboratively to ensure each student achieved their best result possible.

We sincerely congratulate all 75 HSC students and 83 IB students on their impressive achievements:

- **11 students achieved an ATAR of 99 and above**
- **22 students achieved an ATAR of 98 and above**
- **42 students achieved an ATAR of 95 and above**
- **82 students achieved an ATAR of 90 and above**
- **126 students achieved an ATAR of 80 and above**
- **144 students achieved an ATAR of 70 or above**

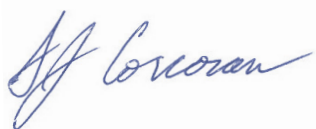

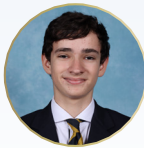

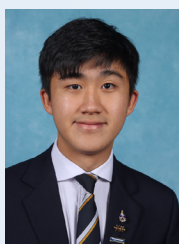

I especially enjoyed the curiosity-based learning and self-directed aspects of the IB course, particularly in the research tasks for each subject, and the holistic approach to learning through Creativity, Action and Service (CAS).

My higher level maths class was always fun, stimulating, engaging and inspiring, and our class loved collaborating and supporting each other throughout the two years. It was a mini community fostered by our amazing teacher, and we were driven to help each other to succeed.

My best memories from Redlands are the extra-curricular opportunities and activities, like the annual musical, the wide variety of music ensembles and school camps, including Arnhem Land and Winter School. I loved how every student had the opportunity and support to pursue the best unique version of themselves.

What I loved the most about Redlands was how familiar and comforting the experience of learning was. The engaging environment allowed me to feel supported and noticed by teachers, whether I needed more help or was feeling confident in a subject.

I would describe learning at Redlands as layered and dynamic. Instead of being asked to memorise content, critical thinking and why something mattered was prioritised, making learning active rather than passive.

The teachers and the supportive learning environment expected consistent effort rather than perfection. Knowing someone believed in me to show up every day and improve pushed me to take responsibility for my own progress.

With the HSC, I enjoyed being able to specialise in my subject choices, and cater them to my own interests. This made each subject very unique and tailored to my skill set, which made each class more exciting.

Out of all my subjects, I enjoyed English the most because it taught me how to think creatively and see ideas through the perspectives of different authors.

From Redlands, I've taken the confidence to speak even when I am not completely sure of myself. Redlands taught me that thinking out loud and asking questions is a critical part of learning, not a weakness.

My advice for current Redlands students is to take every opportunity given to you, and don't wait to feel "ready" before you get involved or speak up. Many of the moments you will look back on will start with discomfort, but lead to more success in the long term.

I would advise current students to stay switched on throughout the year, as being consistent with your study will make the final exams much easier.

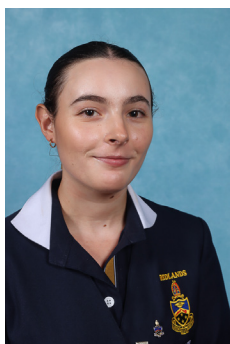

Learning at Redlands allowed me to be constantly pushed by those around me to think deeply, speak freely and develop my ideas through discussion and debate with my teachers and friends.

Undertaking the IB encouraged me to maintain a balance through Theory of Knowledge (TOK) and Creativity, Action and Service (CAS). I was able to grow through deep thinking activities, as well as participate in service projects and physical tasks as much as studying for my exams.

I enjoyed Theory of Knowledge the most, because it broke away from the traditional learning structure and allowed me to connect ideas from my other IB subjects and think freely by debating abstract ideas with my teacher and peers.

What I especially loved was being able to form relationships both horizontally (across my cohort) and vertically (across Year Groups) through a range of shared activities, which allowed me to learn from others and play a role in supporting those who came after me.

The collaborative environment, combined with the support from my three sisters and parents at home, created balance in my life through sport, music, theatre and other time beyond school that helped me to develop as an individual.

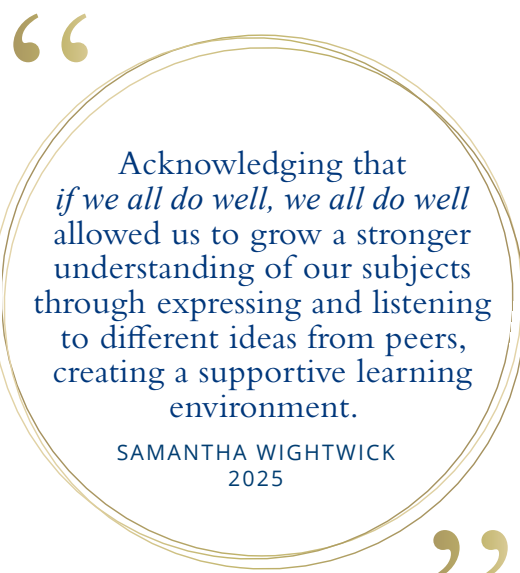


Samantha Wightwick
